**UVI RESEARCH AND TECHNOLOGY PARK ANNOUNCES
APPROVAL OF 15-YEAR CORPORATE TAX INCENTIVES FOR
ADVENIAT AND TROPICAL TOWER.**

St. Croix, USVI (November 03, 2008) - The University of the Virgin Islands Research and Technology Park (RTPark) announced today that it has authorized the establishment of “Protected Cells” for two key technology-based companies in the U.S. Virgin Islands (USVI), marking the first time RTPark has used its authority to extend territorial tax incentives to qualifying businesses. The authorizations follow detailed due diligence, and final ratification of underlying strategic alliance agreements by the RTPark Board of Directors in its September 10, 2008 meeting.

The companies receiving Protected Cell status are VI E-Cell Adveniat Corporation, an affiliate of Baltimore, MD-based Baltimore Technology Park (“Adveniat”), and Tropical Tower Company, Ltd. (“Tropical Tower” or “TT”), a company formed by Cornelius B. Prior, Jr. to hold and manage certain telecommunications assets in the USVI. Mr. Prior is also Chairman of Salem, MA-based Atlantic Tele-Network Inc. (NASDAQ: ATNI).

Under USVI law, RTPark may extend territorial tax incentives to qualifying businesses through the authorization of “Protected Cells.” To qualify as a Protected Cell, a business must be validly-organized and licensed in the USVI, be an RTPark tenant, and be an “Electronic Commerce Business,” an “e-Commerce Business,” or a “Knowledge-Based Business” as defined in legislation¹, among other conditions.

RTPark’s tax incentives² provide that each Protected Cell shall be entitled to reduce the income tax liability shown on its income tax return for the taxable year by (up to) ninety percent (90%) on income from USVI sources and income that is effectively connected with the conduct of a USVI trade or business pursuant to sections 934(b)(1) and 937 of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code. Additional exemptions on real property, gross receipts and excise taxes are provided as well. The benefit period is established for fifteen (15) years, and is renewable under certain circumstances³.

“Our corporate tax incentives align qualifying companies with RTPark’s economic development initiatives intended to foster the growth of a diversified, globally competitive technology sector in the USVI,” stated David M. Zumwalt, RTPark’s Executive Director. “In addition, the U.S. Treasury Department’s April, 2008 publication of final regulations for Section 937 has done much to clarify the applicability of these incentives to Knowledge-Based Businesses with respect to the federal tax code.”

Adveniat will manage RTPark’s collocation/data center facility inside the Global Crossing fiber hub on St. Croix, and Tropical Tower will manage RTPark’s global telecommunications connectivity and network capacity inside the Global Crossing fiber hub on St. Croix, for the benefit of RTPark tenants and partners. Zumwalt added, “Adveniat and Tropical Tower have been exemplary partners, and have collectively committed \$10 million in new capital investment to improve technology infrastructure in the U.S. Virgin Islands.”
